#### 1. CONTEXT OF THE CALL

The present Call concerns Stage B – Submission by the beneficiaries of their detailed proposal (Application Form with all mandatory documents).

In the framework of the present Call, the potential Lead Beneficiaries, that their Concept Notes were positively assessed in Stage A. are called to submit their detailed Application Form with all mandatory documents, as described in the present Call, exclusively via MIS.

The 1st Call for Project Proposals intends to select high quality cross-border projects, in which relevant institutions cooperate to make border regions more resilient to common challenges, find shared solutions in fields such as environment, research, education, transport, sustainable energy, tourism, health and more, and to exploit the untapped growth potential in border areas, while enhancing the cooperation process for the purposes of the overall harmonious development of the Union.

Within the 1st Call for Project Proposals, proposals are submitted under the three programme priorities (P1, P2 and P3) and eight specific objectives (as listed in §2 of ToR). The description of programme priorities and objectives, together with exemplary actions, is provided for in chapter 2 of the Interreg Programme (IP) available at the programme website, which defines the programme strategy and intervention logic for Interreg VI-A Greece-Italy Programme 2021-2027 as adopted by the European Commission.

Project applicants are invited to submit in Stage B their detailed proposals under one (1) of the Specific Objectives as submitted in Stage A and under one (1) Intervention Field. In case of multiple intervention





fields declared in Stage A, the one having the biggest budget must be selected and declared in Stage B. The project objectives and the proposed activities shall be clear and in-line with the Programme priorities, contribute to the achievement of Programme indicators and both shall have an impact on Greece-Italy area.

#### Financing Activities located outside the programme area

The Programme area covers geographical areas in the two participating countries as above. In principle, all activities of a project should take place within the Programme area. If a project plans to finance activities or events outside the programme area, this is possible in the context of cooperation Programmes. Exceptions to this principle may be granted for EU partners from outside the Programme area and for Assimilated Partners in duly justified cases.

If activities (including travel and accommodation) and/ or events are planned outside the programme area, the following conditions need to be satisfied:

- a) the activity and/ or event are for the benefit of the Programme area;
- b) the activity and/ or event are essential for the implementation of the project;
- the implementation and/ or the relevance of the activity and/ or the event have been approved by the Programme beforehand (foreseen in the Application Form or, if not, have been previously authorised by the MA/JS).

Infrastructure located outside the Programme area, even if it is directly related to the project either for the development or for implementation, shall not be eligible.

#### 3. BUDGET OF THE CALL

The Programme will allocate approximately **44.982.682,33 EUR** (EU & National Funds) to the present Call for Project Proposals. The EU contribution rate is 75%. Beneficiaries shall ensure the needed own contribution (public and/or private, if applicable).

An indicative budget allocation (EU & National Funds) to the programme priorities and to the specific objectives is presented in Annex I – Table 2. In the context of the present Call, projects will be included up to the amount of the budget of the Call. When selecting projects to be funded, such allocation may be adapted by the Monitoring Committee (MC) according to programme needs. Projects may be selected up to **100**% of the budget of the present Call for Project Proposals, if deemed necessary.

#### 4. PROJECT DURATION

Projects should be concluded within a maximum period of **twenty-four (24) months** after the signing of the Subsidy Contract (SC) between the Managing Authority/ Secretary General for Partnership Agreement and the Lead Beneficiary. Projects that have started their implementation before the signing of the contract, and in any case after 1/1/2021, should not have been concluded before the application for funding at the present Call for Project Proposals.

This limit applies for the operative phase of the project and does not include the preparation phase.

#### 5. ELIGIBILITY OF APPLICANTS

In the context of the present 1<sup>st</sup> Call for Project Proposals – STAGE B, are invited EXCLUSIVELY the potential Lead Beneficiaries and the Partnership Schemes of the relevant positively assessed proposals as approved to participate in Stage B (See Annex II: Table of LB Recipients).

According to the 1<sup>st</sup> Call for Project Proposals – STAGE A (117769/08.12.2023), eligible applicants are the entities that fall into the below categories of potential Beneficiaries:

- a) national, regional or local public bodies
- b) bodies governed by public law (as defined in Article 2(4) of Directive 2014/24/EU) meaning bodies that have





all of the following characteristics:

- a they are established for the specific purpose of meeting needs in the general interest, not having an industrial or commercial character;
- b. they have legal personality; and
- c. they are financed, for the most part, by the State, regional or local authorities, or by other bodies governed by public law; or are subject to management supervision by those authorities or bodies; or have an administrative, managerial or supervisory board, more than half of whose members are appointed by the State, regional or local authorities, or by other bodies governed by public law;
- c) **bodies governed by private law**, non-profit organisations founded according to private law can be eligible under the following conditions as a whole:
- a. they are not established with the goal to obtain profit,
- b. they do not distribute profits to the shareholders,
- c. they should have at least completed one accounting year of operation before the launch of the specific call for proposals. This rule is also applicable for the local-regional subsidiary/branch offices.

It should be noted that private companies, not falling under the conditions listed at point (c) are not eligible.

- d) international organisations registered under the national law of the Member States of the Programme can be considered as eligible if they fulfil the criteria foreseen for the non-profit bodies governed by private law. However, international organisations operating under international law are not eligible
- e) **European Grouping of Territorial Cooperation (EGTC)**. Eligible EGTC must be governed by the law of one of the participating countries where the EGTC has its registered office. EGTCs located outside the Programme area and not registered in one of the Member States participating in the cross-border Programme are not eligible for funding. An EGTC cannot be a sole beneficiary of a project proposal

Bodies governed by public law (under category b. above) and private organisations (under category c. above) and EGTC (under category e. above) should have at least completed one accounting year of operation before the launching of the Call for proposals. If a body governed by public law or a private organization is participating through a branch located at the Programme area, the branch must be operational for at least 12 months before the launching of the call for proposals.

In principle, to become a project beneficiary, the legal address of the beneficiary's organisation has to be located in the eligible area of the Programme with the exception of:

- organisations located outside the Programme area but having local/regional subsidiary/branch office established in the Programme area;
- bodies of the central government located outside the Programme area (e.g. Ministries or other governmental authorities with specific competencies on national level);
- organisations located outside the Programme area but inside the Member States participating in the crossborder Programme if their participation in the project brings added value and expertise to its implementation and benefits the Programme cooperation area.

Organisation located outside the Programme area not registered in one of the Member states participating in the cross-border Programme are not eligible for funding.





#### 6. ELIGIBILITY OF PARTNERSHIPS

In the context of the present 1<sup>st</sup> Call for Project Proposals – STAGE B, are invited EXCLUSIVELY the Partnership Schemes of the relevant positively assessed proposals as approved to participate in Stage B.

As a minimum requirement, the project partnership must involve 2 partners, at least one from each Member State. The partnership scheme must not exceed 6 partners.

In line with Article 2(9) of the CPR, beneficiaries are responsible for initiating and/or implementing projects. They can be public or private legal entities of both participating countries; and shall cooperate in the development and implementation of operations, as well as in the staffing or financing of operations, or both in accordance with Article 23(4) of the ETC Regulation.

#### 7. ELIGIBILITY OF EXPENDITURE

- 7.1 The end date of the eligibility period for the costs of the proposed operations is defined as 31.12.2029. The end date of the proposed projects (completion in both physical and financial terms of the project) should be by the above date.
- 7.2 Projects that have been physically completed or fully executed before the application for funding at the present Call for Project Proposals are not eligible, regardless of whether or not the related payments have been made.
- 7.3 Project budget requirements (incl. EU & National Funds)

The minimum budget of the submitted project proposals is defined as the amount of 900.000,00 €.

The maximum budget of the submitted project proposals is defined as the amount of 2.500.000,00 €.

In the context of the present 1<sup>st</sup> Call for Project Proposals – STAGE B, the project proposals that are invited EXCLUSIVELY to participate in Stage B according to Annex II: Table of LB Recipients have been checked and meet the above budget requirements. The total project budget of the proposals to be submitted in Stage B cannot deviate from the one submitted and approved during Stage A (unless differently is recommended in notification letters of Stage A). The budget per work package/ deliverable can be changed without changing the overall budget.

#### 7.4 Partners budget requirements (incl. EU & National Funds)

The minimum budget of the submitted project proposal per project partner is defined as the amount of 150.000€.

#### 7.5 Associated Partners budget requirements (incl. EU & National Funds)

- 7.6 The ERDF co-financing to beneficiaries may be reduced in case of State aid relevance of project activities, in compliance with relevant rules on State aid (see § State Aid and de minimis regime of the PPIM). In such a case State aid is granted under the *de minimis* regime & *GBER* within the project.
- 7.7 The MA may modify the total amount of the public expenditure of the present Call or may proceed with a justified termination of the validity of the Call, informing in any case the beneficiaries through the programme website.
- 7.8 The eligibility rules for the costs of the co-financed operations are specified in Programme and Project Implementation Manual.

The simplified cost options applied to the projects will not be able to be modified either during its implementation or upon its completion.

For all expenses that will be reimbursed using the simplified cost option, Beneficiaries will not provide paid receipts of expenses or documents of equivalent accounting value maintained in the Beneficiary's accounting system.

- 7.11. Costs within the budget lines 'Staff costs', 'Travel & Accommodation costs' and 'External Expertise & Services', which have been incurred for the preparation of the project, are eligible for funding if they do not exceed the amount of €30.000 at project level.
- 7.12. The management costs of each project beneficiary should not exceed 10% of its total budget. For the Lead Beneficiary this percentage shall be limited to 15% of its budget.





7.13. Communication costs cannot exceed 15% of the total project budget, without limits at beneficiary level.

7.14. The Office and Administration costs cannot exceed the 4% of the total beneficiary's budget in both reimbursement option.

Detailed eligibility rules on activities and related expenditure are described in the *Project and Programme Implementation Manual*. As for the Greek Beneficiaries it is mandatory to advise Annex 18: Ministerial Decision 45820/17-05-2023 (Government Gazette B' 3218/17-05-2023) concerning "Expenditure eligibility rules, public procurement, complaints of the beneficiaries of the INTERREG Programmes 2021-2027" for the eligibility rules of Greek beneficiaries.

#### 8. INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE SUBMISSION OF PROJECT PROPOSALS

The bodies, which have successfully completed the evaluation process of the Concept Note (Stage A) and are listed in Annex II: Table of LB Recipients of this call, will receive an automated notification for the return of the 'MIS Application Form' in order to proceed with its re-processing and completion of it based on the instructions in Annex 16 'Guidelines for applying in MIS 2021-2027'.

Bodies that are not registered in the MIS Registry yet (i.e. do not already have an 'MIS Body Code') should apply for issuance of Body Code according to the instructions in Annex 16, before submitting the proposal.

The Application Form with all the attached mandatory documents, is submitted via MIS, by the Lead Beneficiary's legal representative (personal user account of the legal representative).

from 10/09/2024 (start date for submission of proposals), time 14:00 Greek local time (CET+1)

until exclusively 11/11/2024 (deadline for submission of proposals), time 14:00 Greek local time (CET+1) at the latest.

After the successful submission of the proposal, the Beneficiaries are informed about it through the MIS. No proposals submitted afterwards will be accepted.

The beneficiaries are required to have two types of personal user accounts (username and password) to access the MIS:

- 1. the Beneficiaries' officers to fill in the forms and
- 2. the <u>Lead Beneficiary's</u> legal representative for submitting proposals, or another user of the system authorized for submission.

If the Beneficiaries does not already have a "Body Code" in the MIS from the period 2014-2020, should apply for a body code.

Instructions for obtaining a Body Code and/or User Account in MIS can be found at Applicant's Package Annexes 16,17.

The Application Form (AF) is the Beneficiary's proposal and is completed exclusively in the electronic format available at the MIS. Instructions for filling in the fields of the Application Form are attached to the present Call (Annex 16)

The submission of proposal also constitutes an application for funding of the potential beneficiaries

#### 9. SELECTION PROCESS

The selection process is articulated as follows:

#### STAGE B: Project proposal submission

Only the specified by the Managing Authority beneficiaries submit their project proposals. The project proposal must be submitted **no later than 60 calendar days after the date of the notification of the Lead beneficiary** that the Project is eligible to proceed to submission Stage B. Proposals submitted after the above deadline will not be accepted.





After the submission of the detailed proposal (Application Form & mandatory documents) by the potential Lead Beneficiary, the selection process and approval of projects is as follows.

#### 9.1 Evaluation of the proposals by the Managing Authority of the Cooperation Programme in two stages:

Stage B' – Evaluation of the Project Proposals

The evaluation is based on methodology and criteria approved by the Monitoring Committee, which are attached to Stage B call and begins after the deadline for submitting Project Proposals of this call.

This stage consists of three phases as follows:

Phase B1: Administrative & Project Eligibility Assessment

Phase B2: Quality Assessment

Phase B3: Beneficiaries Eligibility Assessment & State Aid Compliance for Project Proposals which have been positively evaluated in Stages B1 and B2

During the evaluation, the MA may request the beneficiary, at Stage B' of the evaluation (B1 & B2 Phase) to submit additional information and clarifications, within a specific deadline.

Additional data are those which, while foreseen in the Call, were not submitted due to an omission (or a set of permitted errors) by the potential beneficiary and have been issued before the submission of the proposal. Clarifications are items requested by the evaluator(s), in order to clarify the submitted information and better understand the content of the proposal. In the case of an external evaluator from the Register of Evaluators, clarifications can be requested exclusively through the Managing Authority provided its consent.

Upon completion of the comparative assessment of Phase B1 & B2, the proposals are ranked in descending order based on their score per Specific Objective, following the approval of MC. Upon the completion of comparative assessment, projects as approved by MC proceed in Phase B3 assessment.

### 9.2 Publication of a provisional list of evaluated proposals for Stage B - for Phases B1 & B2 and for Phase B3.

#### 9.3 Submission and examination of complaints

The potential Beneficiaries may submit a complaint to the competent MA regarding the results of the evaluation (see PPIM). Complaints are submitted once per evaluation stage, within a subversive deadline of seven (7) working days from the day following the notification of the evaluation results, namely:

- b) of the Provisional Ranking Table of evaluated proposals issued during Stage B': Phase B1' & B2' of the evaluation.
- b) of the Provisional Ranking Table of evaluated proposals issued during Stage B': Phase B3' of the evaluation.

Upon completion of the examination of the complaints concerning:

- Stage B': Phase B1' & B2',
- Stage B': Phase B3'

of the evaluation, the proposals for which the Complaint is accepted are added to the ranking table, in the order in which they are ranked by their score, in order to produce the Final Ranking Table of evaluated proposals. (see PPIM).
